The number is only used to ensure that forms are distributed to the correct school and to allow the information to be analysed for the school. 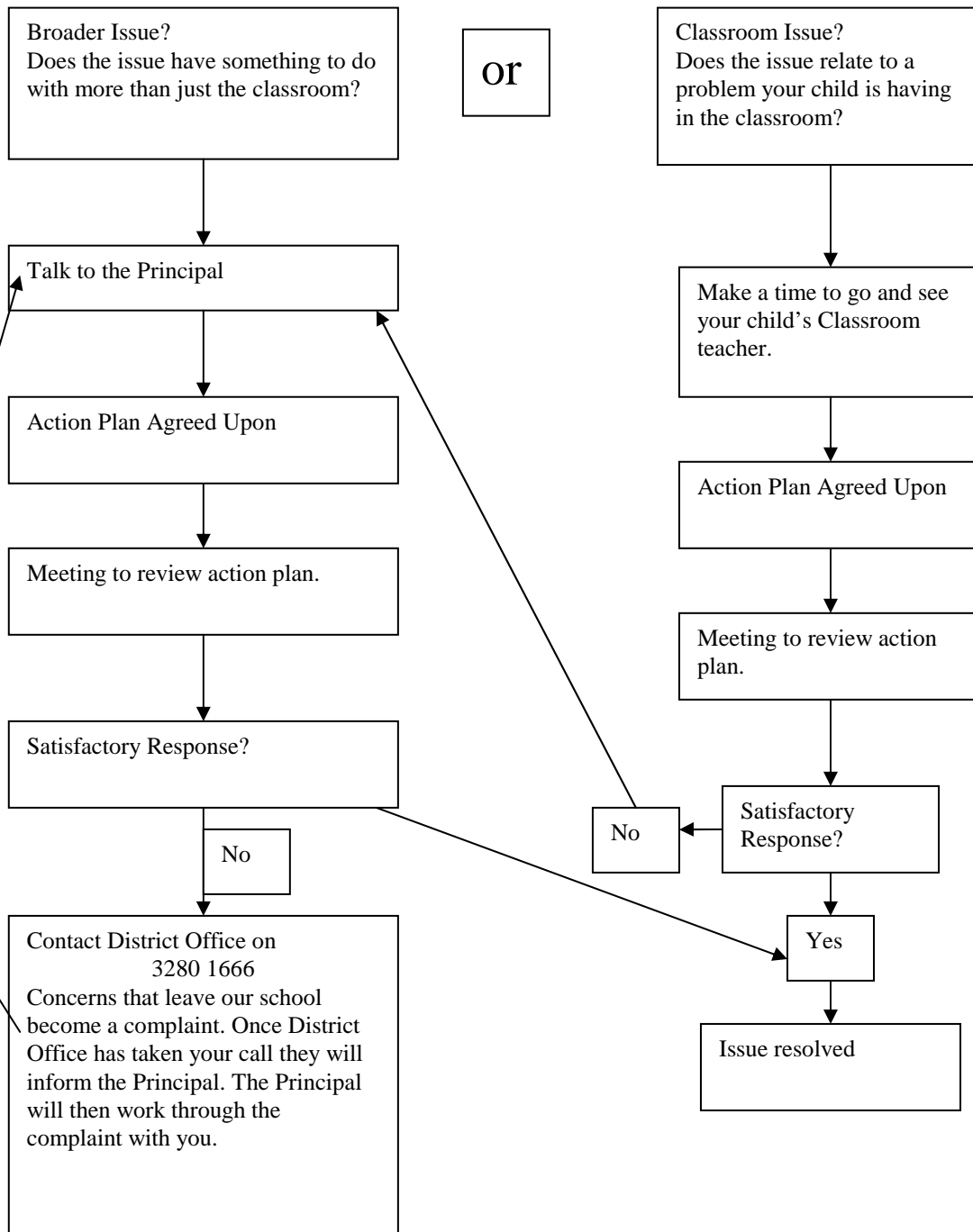

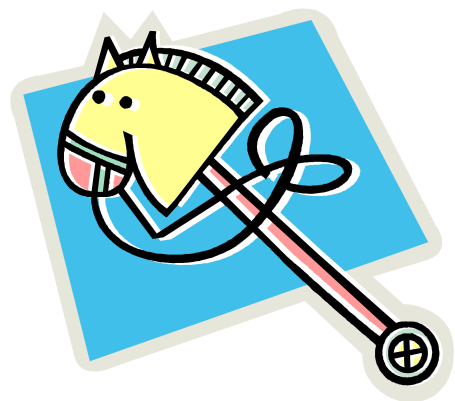

The Glamorgan Vale Country Fair Gallop

Many years ago Glamorgan Vale played host to the Glamorgan Vale Gallop at the Brian and Glenys Bate's property. It was a great day with Barrel Racing, Steer wrestling, Poddy Calf Rides, Roping and even Horse Sprints. The highlight of the day was the running of the Glamorgan Vale Gallop where riders would race their horses over a cross country track all attempting to be the winner of 'The Gallop'.

This year at the Country Fair we are going to honour those wonderful days by running our own Glamorgan Vale Gallop!. Of course some things have changed and gone are the four legged horse variety - instead we'll be using **Homemade Stick Horses**. They eat less and are much easier to handle! This isn't going to be a gentle canter around the oval though, as the course we have set up will be full of thrills and spills!

It is important that your Stick Horse is **Home Made** rather than just bought off the shelf at a toy store. You will be racing on the school oval along a challenging track - complete with jumps!. Depending on the number of entries we will have at least 3 races - Preps - year 2, Year 3 & 4 and Year 5 & 6. Of course Mums and Dad's won't miss out as we'll be having some gallops for them too! There will also be a prize for the best presented homemade Horse and the Best Dressed Rider and most Original Named Horse.



The Gallops will commence in the afternoon around 3pm. If you're not sure how to make a Stick horse we have one method you might want to use at the end of the Roundup. This is only a suggestion. Please feel free to come up with your own design or method. So get out those broom handles and socks out and start building!

Bottle Stall

As per usual we'll be having a bottle stall at the fair. What is a bottle stall you may ask? Well it's a stall where we sell numbered bottles filled with goodies. You purchase a ticket for \$2.00 and then draw out a number and that corresponding bottle is yours! So what we're chasing from everyone are bottles filled with goodies for the stall. Use your imagination - all we ask is that it's non perishable. Even if you have something you'd like to donate that doesn't fit in a bottle - no problem - we'll put a note in the bottle for that item.

Help Needed for the Country Fair

As you can see we are going to need an enormous amount of help to make the day a success. We have tried a number of ways of enlisting help on the day. The most successful has been the roster system whereby every family is allocated a time to work in one of the stalls or rides or in the running of the event. How to Build a Stick horse

Things You'll Need :

- a stick
- a sock
- string or light rope
- something to stuff inside the sock
- 2 buttons
- odds and ends to decorate the horse's head

1. Step 1

Choose a stick. A suitable stick horse can be a cut-down broomstick or other piece of wood. It needs to be long enough for the child to straddle it with one end on the ground and the other end about chest-high.

2. Step 2



Find an orphan sock and some string, rope or yarn. The sock could be white, black, gray, tan or brown depending on the look you want for the horse.

3. Step 3

Rags make an adequate stuffing for the horse's head or some old-pillow stuffing. Fill the sock with whatever you chose for the stuffing.

4. Step 4

Place the sock over the end of the stick. Wiggle the stick up into the stuffing. Add more stuffing if needed.

5. Step 5



Use the string, lightweight rope, or yarn to tightly tie the sock's ankle part to the stick. Even a long shoestring would work. Help the child with this part, as it is hard for them to tie the rope tightly enough that the head won't fall off.

6. Step 6



Tie the rope or string around the horse's nose (the toe of the sock) and make reins for the rider of the stick horse. You can make a full bridle for the sock horse head if you want.

7. Step 7


Decorate the sock horse head anyway you want. Glue or sew on buttons for eyes or just add them with a felt-tipped marker. If you want to get more elaborate, give the horse a mane. You can put a line of glue down the neck of the horse and stick pieces of yarn to it. An alternate way is to cut a fringe in a square of fabric, then glue the uncut side to the horse's neck.
